ourism is a strategic sector for the sustainable development of the European economy. Europe remains the top tourist destination in the world, with more than 480 million visitors each year, or 53.6% of all tourists. Tourism generates approximately 10% of the European GDP and accounts for more than 20 million jobs. It is estimated that over 710 million people will visit Europe in 2020.

Tourism is competitive if it is sustainable, that is, if it preserves and enhances the environmental, human, and cultural resources of the resident populations. In order to be sustainable it should be planned. Spontaneous tourism, entirely given over to the market, will become unsustainable over time, and therefore uncompetitive.
